L.Y.R.I.C. 2025 will address issues concerning resistance, refusal, agency, critical pedagogy in schools and how youth of the global majority 'experience punishment, surveillance, and differential treatment' (Brown, 2023) in society. L.Y.R.I.C. participants will each produce artivisions to spread the message of social justice, equity, healing and accountability through a variety of public facing creative art projects - "artivism" (activism through art) (Brown, 2023).

This guide equips individuals with the foundational tools to design and implement a PhotoVoice project. Photovoice combines photography and storytelling to explore social, political, and economical issues through lived experience.

This guide introduces users to core concepts, such as developing a research question, identifying and addressing bias, understanding ethics and consent, and the impact of visual storytelling. Individuals will explore a range of PhotoVoice project examples to deepen their understanding of approach, audience, and purpose; while exploring practical steps for planning and curating a PhotoVoice project, from concept development to sharing results through exhibitions, publications, or digital platforms.

The goal is to empower individuals to use PhotoVoice as a tool for advocacy, reflection, and change. By the end of the guide, users will be equipped to embark on their own PhotoVoice journey, supported by resources that help them document, interpret, and amplify the stories that matter most.
